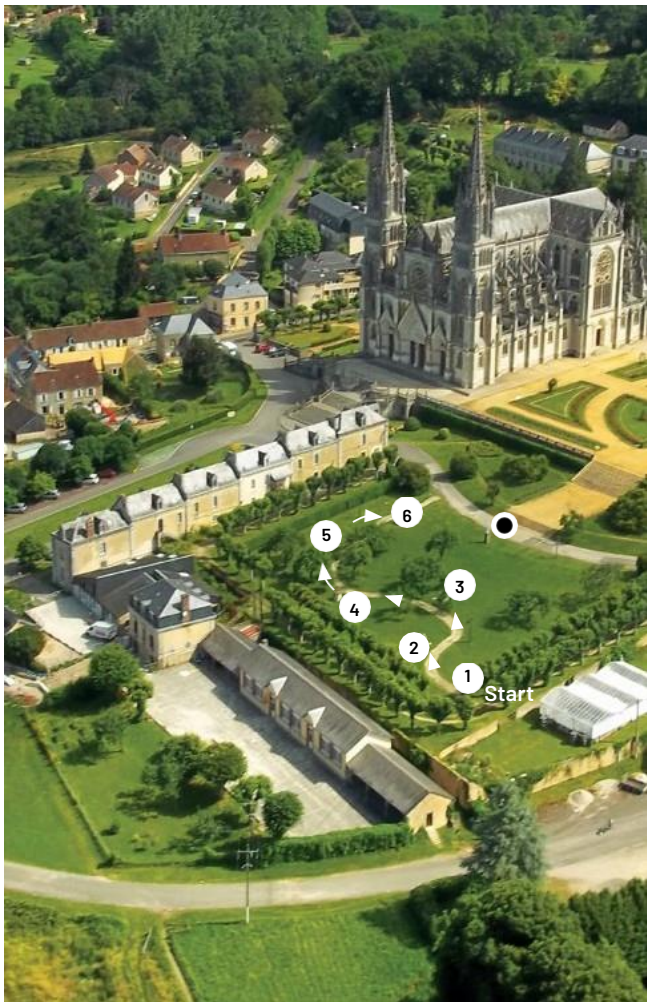

beloved deceased.

So that we thus may step forward
onto inner healing.

The Stations are the work of the French sculptor Daniel
Esmaingt and that of the young people at the Corner Stone
workshop in Brignoles (Normandy), the stations were donated
by the Fondation d'Auteuil.

Meditation:

After the Sabbath, a few women went to the tomb, overwhelmed with despair and grief. Yet that dawn was a new beginning, glowing with a different radiance, that day would rejuvenate the universe through and through. The women stepped into the light, and they saw an angel who told them soothing words. And their hearts leaped with joy! They left in haste to bring the good news to Peter and his brothers.

Let us pray:

Lord, we entrust our beloved deceased with you; may our petitioning for them endure forever. Enfold them with your mercy. Console the broken hearted who mourn their loved ones. Grant us hope of being one day reunited with our dear departed, along with you, in your Kingdom.

**Scripture reading:
according to Matthew (28,
1-8)**

After the Sabbath, as the first day of the week was dawning, Mary Magdalene and the other Mary came to see the tomb.

And behold, there was a great earthquake; for an angel of the Lord descended from heaven, approached, rolled back the stone, and sat upon it.

His appearance was like lightning and his clothing was white as snow.

The guards were shaken with fear of him and became like dead men.

Then the angel said to the women in reply, "Do not be afraid! I know that you are seeking Jesus the crucified. He is not here, for he has been raised just as he said. Come and see the place where he lay.

Then go quickly and tell his disciples, 'He has been raised from the dead, and he is going before you to Galilee; there you will see him.' Behold, I have told you."

Then they went away quickly from the tomb, fearful yet overjoyed, and ran to announce this to his disciples.

Meditation:

Peter sets off and run, John,
younger, overtakes him. Once
at the tomb, Peter is first to
enter; he sees the burial
cloths left there, and the
linen, used to cover the
Lord's face, rolled apart.
Where is the angel, where is
the light that the women
saw? No other sign than the
burial cloths. John enters,
sees, and believes. The light
of faith surged in his heart.

Let us pray

Lord, we commend our faith
with you, often so fragile with
regards to death and its
painful reality. Help us to
propagate hope in eternal
life, especially among people
who are disheartened.

**Scripture reading:
according to John (20, 5-10)**

So Peter and the other disciple went out and came to the tomb. They both ran, but the other disciple ran faster than Peter and arrived at the tomb first; he bent down and saw the burial cloths there, but did not go in.

When Simon-Peter arrived after him, he went into the tomb and saw the burial cloths there, and the cloth that had covered his head, not with the burial cloths but rolled up in a separate place.

Then the other disciple also went in, the one who had arrived at the tomb first, and he saw and he believed.

For they did not yet understand the scripture that he had to rise from the dead. Then the disciples returned home.

Meditation:

Mary of Magdala stood in tears,
heartbroken; oblivious to all in
her grieving. Jesus spoke and
called "Mary!", only then was
she able to answer: "Rabbi!"

Hearing her name called by
Jesus was like lightning
shooting through her inner
gloom. From then on, she
was called to entertain a
new kind of relation with
Jesus, and become his
familiar from a spiritual
standpoint. We alike are
invited to establish one with
him. For, indeed, it is by
faith that we truly connect
with the Son of God.

Let us pray

Lord, we entrust you with
people in agony, especially
those dying without the
support of family or friends.
May your holy angels,
together with St. Joseph
and your Holy Mother, come
to their aid at this specially
trying time for our nature.

**Scripture reading
according to John (20, 11-18)**

But Mary stayed outside the tomb weeping. And as she wept, she bent over into the tomb and saw two angels in white sitting there, one at the head and one at the feet where the body of Jesus had been. And they said to her, "Woman, why are you weeping?"

She said to them, "They have taken my Lord, and I don't know where they laid him." When she had said this, she turned around and saw Jesus there, but did not know it was Jesus.

Jesus said to her, "Woman, why are you weeping? Who are you looking for?" She thought it was the gardener and said to him, "Sir, if you carried him away, tell me where you laid him, and I will take him."

Jesus said to her, "Mary!" She turned and said to him in Hebrew, "Rabbi," which means Teacher. Jesus said to her, "Stop holding on to me, for I have not yet ascended to the Father. But go to my brothers and tell them, 'I am going to my Father and your Father, to my God and your God.'" Mary of Magdala went and announced to the disciples, "I have seen the Lord," and what he told her.

Scripture reading according to Luke (24, 13-27)

Now that very day two of them were going to a village seven miles from Jerusalem called Emmaus, and they were conversing about all the things that had occurred. And it happened that while they were conversing and debating, Jesus himself drew near and walked with them but their eyes were prevented from recognizing him.

He asked them, "What are you discussing as you walk along?" They stopped, looking downcast. One of them, named Cleopas, said to him in reply, "Are you the only visitor to Jerusalem who does not know of the things that have taken place there in these days?"

And he replied to them, "What sort of things?" They said to him, "The things that happened to Jesus the Nazarene, who was a prophet mighty in deed and word before God and all the people, how our chief priests and rulers both handed him over to a sentence of death and crucified him.

But we were hoping that he would be the one to redeem Israel; and besides all this, it is now the third day since this took place. Some women from our group, however, have astounded us: they were at the tomb early in the morning; they were at the tomb early in the morning and did not find his body; they came back and reported that they had indeed seen a vision of angels who announced that he was alive. Then some of those with us went to the tomb and found things just as the women had described, but him they did not see."

And he said to them, "Oh, how foolish you are! How slow of heart to believe all that the prophets spoke! Was it not necessary that the Messiah should suffer these things and enter into his glory?"

Then beginning with Moses and all the prophets, he interpreted to them what referred to him in all the scriptures.

Meditation:

The Risen Christ meets his
Apostles, entrenched in the
Upper Room. The Blessed
Virgin Mary is also there.
Jesus' salutation illustrates his
mercy and consideration.
"Peace be with you!"
By his blood and water sprung
forth from his side, Jesus
poured out grace onto the
world so as to redeem each
soul. Only he can give us true
inner peace, which comes
when we accept his mercy.

Let us pray

Lord, we entrust our death into
your hands. We neither know
when nor how we shall die, yet
we wish to remit you with our
life.
Help us grow in charity, for it
will be the measure of our
participation to your glory.

Scripture according to John (20, 24-29)

Thomas, called Didymus, one of the Twelve, was not with them when Jesus came. So the other disciples said to him, "We have seen the Lord."

But he said to them, "Unless I see the mark of the nails in his hands and put my finger into the nail marks and put my hand into his side, I will not believe."

Now a week later his disciples were again inside and Thomas was with them. Jesus came, although the doors were locked, and

stood in their midst and said, "Peace be with you." Then he said to Thomas, "Put your finger here and see my hands, and bring your hand and put it into my side, and do not be unbelieving, but believe." Thomas answered and said to him, "My Lord and my God!" Jesus said to him, "Have you come to believe because you have seen me? Blessed are those who have not seen and have believed."

Proceed to the 6th Station :
"Hail Mary..."

Meditation:

Shadowing the despondent
hours, the Apostles resumed
their usual life. As they were
busy fishing, Jesus appeared
and invited them to cast their
nets at a different spot,
assuring them: "You will find."
Yet despite their weariness,

the catch was indeed
abundant.

Our union to Jesus, the
Risen Christ, imparts
fertility to all we undertake
in our daily life, no matter
how difficult it might be at
times. "Without me, you can
do nothing."

Let us pray

Lord, we commend to you
families touched by violent
loss, suicide or accidental
death, altogether with
parents who have lost a
child. May your soothing
grace heal the grieving,
and may your mercy be
with all departed souls.

Scripture reading according to John (21, 1-13)

After this, Jesus revealed himself again to his disciples at the Sea of Tiberias. He revealed himself in this way. Together were Simon Peter, Thomas called Didymus, Nathanael from Cana in Galilee, Zebedee's sons, and two others of his disciples. Simon Peter said to them, "I am going fishing." They said to him, "We also will come with you." So they went out and got into the boat, but that night they caught nothing. When it was already dawn, Jesus was standing on the shore; but the disciples did not realize that it was Jesus. Jesus said to them, "Children, have you caught anything to eat?" They answered him, "No." So he said to them, "Cast the net over the right side of the boat and you will find something." So they cast it, and were not able to pull it in because of the number of fish. So the disciple whom Jesus loved

said to Peter, "It is the Lord." When Simon Peter heard that it was the Lord, he tucked in his garment, for he was lightly clad, and jumped into the sea. The other disciples came in the boat, for they were not far from shore, only about a hundred yards, dragging the net with the fish. When they climbed out on shore, they saw a charcoal fire with fish on it and bread. Jesus said to them, "Bring some of the fish you just caught." So Simon Peter went over and dragged the net ashore full of one hundred fifty-three large fish. Even though there were so many, the net was not torn. Jesus said to them, "Come, have breakfast." And none of the disciples dared to ask him, "Who are you?" because they realized it was the Lord. Jesus came over and took the bread and gave it to them, and in like manner the fish.
