What is a Montligeon Prayer Group?

1250 prayer groups in over 30 countries

It is a communion of faithful who regularly come together in order to pray for the deceased and for the people recommended to the Fraternity of Our Lady of Montligeon.

Members of a same Fraternity...

It is important that the prayer group remains in close contact with the Fraternity in Montligeon, France, by email, phone, or post. The members might even consider to attend a pilgrimage at the shrine of Our Lady of Montligeon (seat of the Fraternity and world center of prayer pour the deceased), or request in connexion with their parish, requesting one of the shrine chaplains visit them for a training session, or a retreat; they also engage in disseminating the enrolment in the spiritual Fraternity (for the perpetual Mass).

... Inserted in their parish...

The Fraternity Our Lady of Montligeon is an R.C. Association, acknowledged by the Holy See. Each prayer group endeavours to be grounded in its own parochial life and, with the consent of the parish priest or relevant authority, to engage in supporting the parish activities and/or in some tangible charitable activities (eg. at their local hospital, home for the elderly, school, or religious communities, etc).

Three essentials:

Praying for the deceased, especially the most neglected, as well as for the enrolees in the Fraternity.

Christian training, especially on the last truths, in order to deepen one's faith and knowledge of the Church theology.

Tangible charity towards people in bereavement, poverty or need, and sustaining the Church.

A Marian as well as an Eucharistic devotion

The Montligeon prayer groups meet and pray the Rosary together. Whenever possible, the group should take part in the Holy Mass (either prior to the group meeting, or subsequently, or even at a later date) so as to associate to the perpetual Mass celebrated by the Fraternity.

Typical prayer frame

Opening hymn to the Holy Spirit
Petitions
Scripture Reading
Recitation of the Rosary (5 decades)
Prayer to Our Lady of Montligeon
Concluding hymn.

Practical information

A Montligeon prayer group may be initiated with as little as three persons; it will designate a facilitator who will be ensure to maintain the connections with the shrine and the group members, as well as keeping them informed. The prayer group shall meet at the parish, and establish a meeting pattern (monthly, or weekly, etc.) as well as a set day and time.
